ITEMS FOR BREASTFEEDING CHILDREN
Breast milk in small 1-2 oz. quantities, in soft sided freezer bags labeled with the child's name and date expressed.
Feeding bottles with nipples for each breastfeeding child
Battery operated bottle warmer or alternative to thaw and warm breast milk (i.e. body heat, room temperature water bath, heat packs/hand warmers)
Powdered formula and water until you can access breast milk
