

## Child Care Impact Grants

Impact grants = financial support for eligible child care programs to address facility and other demonstrated needs related to health and safety. Funds may be used for the following purposes:

### Minor Renovations

- For home or facility space(s) that are designated for the provision of child care services.
- Must clearly support the child care program in meeting health and safety guidelines and/or meeting the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12101, et seq.).

### Other Activities/Expenses

- May be considered if determined necessary to restart or continue operations safely and are not covered by other funding sources.

*\* Major renovations are not eligible for funding and are defined as: (1) structural changes to the foundation, roof, floor, exterior or load-bearing walls of a facility, or the extension of a facility to increase its floor area; or (2) extensive alteration of a facility such as to significantly change its function and purpose, even if such renovation does not include any structural change.*
