

CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE FACT SHEET

The Child Care Assistance Program is available for families who need help paying for child care costs. With this program, families can find and keep quality child care, which benefits the whole family.

Child care assistance is for:

- Working families
- Some families in education or training
- Teen parents completing high school or their GED
- Families who receive Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
- Foster families with children in foster care

Only 3 steps to the help you need:

1. Apply! In person or online at www.dcf.ks.gov.

To qualify:

- You must apply and can act on your own behalf.
- The family and the child must live in Kansas.
- The child must be under age 13. Certain exceptions apply.
- Must provide all requested income and other information.
- If parents are absent from the home, the one in the home must work with Child Support Services.

2. Select a DCF child care provider.

DCF providers can be found at www.ks.childcareaware.org or call 1-877-678-2548. Licensed providers can also apply to become enrolled with DCF. Certain relatives may be eligible to become a DCF provider.

3. If approved, receive your funds through a Kansas Benefits Card.



Child care assistance is issued to families using an Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) Kansas Benefits card, which is like a debit card. Assistance is available on the Kansas Benefits Card every month. More information on how to use the card will be sent if you are

eligible.

Amount of funds depends on household income, household size, age of child or children, type of provider, and work hours.
