This is a pilot program and requires flexibility, adaptability and the ability to assist Early Childhood Professionals achieve their goals.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Deliver technical assistance/coaching services to a group of family and center child care facilities to help them meet the Links to Quality indicators and help them with continuous quality improvement. Coaching will be conducted onsite, or by webinars and/or telephone.
- Support the programs with collecting evidence for their online portfolio.
- Serve as an expert in early childhood program management, family engagement and community resources available to program participants.
- Facilitate learning community meetings to achieve goals and accomplish movement through the Links to Quality process.
- Collaborate with all partners to achieve goals.
- Collect and report data to meet Links to Quality objectives.

At a minimum, our ideal candidate will have the following qualifications:

- Bachelor's Degree in Early Childhood or related field.
- 1 year providing coaching/technical assistance to child care programs.
- Passion for developing early childhood professionals while influencing the quality of child care for children and their families.
- An understanding of cross sector community supports and services to families.
- Ability to plan, coordinate, conduct and facilitate meetings and conference calls and use technology appropriately.
- Collaboration experience working in a project with multiple partners.
- Ability to identify needs and assist the participant in accessing the best community and/or state resource to meet these needs.
- Willingness to work flexible hours, including overnight travel.
- Valid Kansas driver's license
- Successfully pass comprehensive background checks.
- Proficient using Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint.
- Work well with the public and with a diverse client population.
- Ability to work independently in a fast-paced environment.
